124. Youth Council projects

- a. Charity Variety Show – Youth Cllr Ireland gave thanks to everyone for their initial help and support for this project. She stated that she hoped that they will all learn from their mistakes. Cllr Rowley added that Alan Brodie at Number 8 had offered advice next time an event was to go ahead.

125. Pershore Carnival

Youth Cllr Ireland spoke to Vic Haines, who had previously supplied lorries for floats, to see if one was available but all have been taken, with this in mind, all agreed there was no time to be able to involved in the procession in any way. Various ideas were put forward for a stall at Carnival instead. Youth Cllr Ireland suggested a Balloon Pop stall – with balloons attached to a fence or wall or in a large box, people would pay to pop a balloon with a pin and they may find a winning balloon, in which case they'd win a small prize.

The general agreement was that balloons could also be sold alongside this, Youth Cllr Godber suggested biodegradable balloons which would have a less harsh effect on the environment.

Youth Cllr Godber also suggested making jewellery from kits to sell and also selling some kits along-side it for a profit. If beads could be used that would reflect the colour and vibrancy of the circus that would be ideal.

Other ideas were:

selling 'cake pops', perhaps made, with Circus themed decoration.

Lemon in a cup of water trick – people try and balance a 20p piece on the lemon.

Envelope Drawer – people put their names and address on an envelope with a £1 inside – all are put in a box and a name is drawn who will be the winner.

A working group would meet on 11th May to discuss further ideas.
